The plant

Origin; country or region: Native to tropical western Africa

Growth habit: Can grow anywhere between 6 inches to several feet

Flower description: Rarely flowers indoors

Blooming period/availability: It is a stemless evergreen perennial

Leaf/Foliage Description: Showy, colorful, erect, fleshy, sharply-pointed, sword-shaped leaves are deep green with light gray green horizontal stripes. Leaves rise stiffly in a rosette from a thick rhizome

Usage: An easy-to-grow houseplant that tolerates a wide range of cultural and environmental conditions



Care & Handling

Longevity: With proper care, will last for many years

Water requirements: Water regularly

Do not pour water on the center of the rosette

Over watering often causes root rot

Light: It prefers warm, bright locations, but tolerates some shade

Protect from hot afternoon sun

Soil/Nutrition requirements: Best grown in a well-draining potting mix

Special care/remarks: Has air-purifying qualities

Sanseveria is known to be toxic, keep out of reach of children and

STRENGTHS/OPPORTUNITIES:

Good low-maintenance indoor plan

Used as ground cover fillers in interior landscape designs

Good plant for offices and lobbies

Many colours, sizes and varieties are available

WEAKNESS:

Its form may not be appealing to all

Sensitive to root rot
