Care & Handling

Longevity: 2-3 years

Water requirements: Allow these indoor plants to dry out partially between watering

Light: They are low-light tolerant houseplants

low light tolerant, they will grow faster and maintain their vibrant coloring and markings if grown in medium to bright indirect light
Direct sun will scorch their leaves

Soil/Nutrition requirements: Regular well drained soil
They can live a long time without fertilizer

Special care/remarks: . Arrowhead vines are poisonous if ingested, so be very careful if you have pets and/or small children

Arrowhead vines, as the name implies, want to spread out and extended in all directions. There are some varieties stay more compact, but others will spread it's wings and fly out in all directions! Don't be shy when it comes to pruning back these prolific growers, as they love to be tamed and will become fuller plants when trimmed back
